Leading Story

United States: Storm Decimates Two Alaskan Villages And Drives More Than 1,500 People From Their Homes

Summary

More than 1,500 have been displaced from their homes after Typhoon Halong impacted the Alaskan coast and its villages as more rain and wind affected the area Wednesday. At least one person has died and two are reported missing as a result of the conditions. Areas hit the hardest by the storm were Kipnuk, and Kwigillingok, cut off by state road systems, only reachable by water or air at the time of reports. The National Guard has since been activated to aid with emergency response as officials state the road to recovery will be a long one.

Analysis & Action

A powerful Typhoon dubbed Typhoon Halong impacted Alaska residents over the weekend as remnants of rain and wind persist throughout the week. The development comes as a part of the ongoing hurricane season, known to produce typhoons as well as hurricanes and other storm systems. The aftermath of the storm presents a number of hazardous conditions as emergency crews continue to search for remaining missing personnel. Facilities in the region should prepare for heightened patient counts as injuries are likely to result from the storm.

Physical Security

India: Cop Beaten As Mob Ransacks Egra Hospital

Summary

Staff and police officers at the Egra Sub-Divisional Hospital in Kolkata, India, were violently assaulted by a group of family members protesting within hospital premises. The incident took place last week when relatives took over the facility claiming poor treatment and negligence after the death of a child. Security personnel were allegedly assaulted, and police officers who were soon called to the scene, were also attacked by the mob.

Analysis & Action

The recent incident at a local hospital in Kolkata, India, where security personnel and police officers were assaulted by visitors protesting within the hospital's premises highlights a concerning security issue. The event reveals the need for stricter security measures, especially when demonstrations are being held within the facility, to help contain any aggressive behavior that may arise. Facilities should consider increasing security presence and collaborating with law enforcement whenever demonstrators rally within the premises to avoid an escalation of events that can compromise both staff and patient safety.

Fraud and Criminal Threats

United States: Woman Arrested On 50-Count Indictment For Impersonating A Nurse

Summary

A 44-year-old Las Vegas woman has been accused of impersonating a registered nurse, writing several fake prescriptions and setting up a health sector business all without a license. The woman would engage in providing care to diabetic children, prescribing medication including insulin that if taken without need could result in fatal implications. Investigations uncovered at least 12 children who were prescribed through her work. She now faces a 50-count criminal indictment including 24 charges of unlawfully prescribed substances, and 12 counts of practicing nursing without a license along with other charges.

Analysis & Action

Another incident of fraud in the health sector underscores the threat of those impersonating medical professionals, posing risks to patients' health. These types of schemes have become all the more common in recent years, presenting additional consequences for the health sector such as loss of public trust, and increased liability for harmed patients. Facilities should consider strengthening screening processes, stringent verification, and advanced security such as biometrics to minimize these risks.

Health and Environmental Threats

United States: New York Confirms First Locally Acquired Case Of Chikungunya Virus In Six Years

Summary

New York's State Department of Health has confirmed its first case of locally acquired Chikungunya, located on Long Island. The infected individual is believed to have contracted the virus following a bite from an infected mosquito, classifying the case as locally acquired. Health officials state the risk to the public remains low, as the virus is known to not spread from person to person. Warnings have been advised to residents, asking them to take precautions protecting themselves and family members from mosquito bites.

Analysis & Action

As mosquito-borne illnesses continue to thrive, New York has confirmed its first case of Chikungunya, the first locally acquired case of the virus in the United States since 2019. This comes as other similar illnesses such as West Nile virus have seen surges across the United States. Despite there being minimal risk to the public, those aged 65 and older, and those with conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes, and/or heart disease face increased risk. Facilities should continue to monitor for symptoms of the virus, reporting all new cases for accurate assessments.

Protests & Disruption Events

United States: Marinhealth Medical Center Frontline Workers To Hold Informational Picket

Summary

MarinHealth Medical Center (MHMC) frontline workers held a rally on October 14 to

protest delays in current contract negotiations and alleged unfair treatment. Teamsters Local 856 union members from the facility claim the administration plans to reduce health care benefits and increase the costs to access said benefits. The demonstrations gathered nearly 500 workers, including therapists, technicians from various departments, and nursing assistants.

Analysis & Action

The recent demonstration by several healthcare workers from MarinHealth Medical Center in California over unfair contract terms highlights a widespread concern for healthcare workers. Staff claims over potential reduced access to benefits and related contract terms is a recurrent issue, with union members in negotiation with the MHMC administration since March. Facilities should consider addressing staff concerns as early as possible to avoid widespread demonstrations and subsequent delays in operations.
